Brain Drain

After learning a difficult concept, students will communicate their understanding to reinforce knowledge.

- 1. Stand up.
- 2. Walk five steps in any direction and find a partner.
- 3. Take turns explaining the difficult concept to each other for 30 seconds each.
- 4. When the time is up, walk five steps in a different direction and find a new partner.
- Take turns telling each other what you heard about the difficult concept from your previous partner for 30 seconds each.
- When time is called, return to your seat and "brain drain" by writing down your understanding of the difficult concept.



Repetition helps to reinforce learning.
